# Anna S.F. Lok, M.D. Breakthrough Research Fund

## Dr. Anna S.F. Lok Curing Disease, Creating Hope

People with chronic hepatitis can face years of uncertainty, often undergoing difficult treatment regimens, not knowing whether their disease will lead to potentially deadly complications such as liver cancer. Anna S.F. Lok, M.D., has dedicated her life to ensuring they and their families can have a better future.

A hepatologist whose work has touched three continents and whose trainees now practice around the world, Dr. Lok is a passionate clinician, a tenacious researcher, and a renowned educator. Her work has helped determine which patients with hepatitis B or C should start antiviral treatment. She has been a key researcher in the testing of new drugs for treatment of chronic hepatitis B and chronic hepatitis C, leading to FDA approval of safer and more effective treatments. She and her colleagues believe hepatitis C can be completely controlled in the next decade, bringing an end to suffering and uncertainty for hundreds of millions of people.

Her impact is broadened and enhanced by the international network of specialists who, in training under her direction, learned the importance of striving to look for answers to the problems they encounter in their clinics. Inspired by their mentor's dedication to moving forward, this group meets with Dr. Lok annually so that they can continue to share knowledge and encouragement regarding clinical care, research, and local health policies.

Dr. Lok is the Alice Lohrman Andrews Research Professor of Hepatology; an Associate Chair for Clinical Research in Department of Internal Medicine; and Director of Clinical Hepatology at the University of Michigan, one of the largest and most well-established hepatology programs in the nation.

A frequently invited lecturer at international medical conferences, she has won numerous awards, including the Distinguished Scientist Award from the Hepatitis B Foundation, the Outstanding AGA Women in Science Award from the American Gastroenterological Association Foundation, the Distinguished Service Award from the American Association for the Study of Liver Diseases, and recent recognition by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention as a National Champion for Hepatitis. Her research includes studies on the natural history and treatment of chronic hepatitis B and C, and prevention and treatment of recurrent hepatitis B and C after liver transplantation. She has published more than 350 scientific papers.

She is also a co-author of the American Association for the Study of Liver Diseases' *Practice Guidelines on Hepatitis B*, which provide recommendations on diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of hepatitis B for physicians worldwide. She has trained fellows from all over the world, and many have returned to their home countries to provide state-of-the-art care for their patients.

A native of Hong Kong, Dr. Lok earned her medical degree at the University of Hong Kong and completed a residency at the Queen Mary Hospital. She completed a fellowship in hepatology at the Royal Free Hospital in London and was elected a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians.

In October 2015, Dr. Lok will celebrate 20 years of service to her patients, her trainees, and the field of hepatology at the University of Michigan.

To celebrate her contributions and her passion for excellence and collaboration—which are hallmarks of medicine at Michigan—alumni and friends of the Department of Internal Medicine have launched an effort to establish the Anna S.F. Lok, M.D., Breakthrough Research Fund.
