Alumni Update

I hope all is well with the U of M EM team! I wanted to share an update on my somewhat non-traditional journey since finishing residency.

As some of you may recall, I graduated residency in 2019 and immediately transitioned to a Hospice and Palliative medicine fellowship at Henry Ford. During fellowship, my intention was to ultimately practice palliative care-focused emergency medicine. As you can imagine, being in Detroit as a palliative fellow in 2020 during the pandemic was a heartbreaking and transformative experience. Given the patient volume surge, I was embedded in the Henry Ford ED for much of it – on hand for urgent goals of care conversations and end of life care. In part due to that experience, it became increasingly clear that my skills would be best served by practicing palliative medicine full time.

I ended up accepting a palliative care position at Corewell (formerly Spectrum) Health – MSU in Grand Rapids, as core faculty in their fellowship program. I spent my first year there building a serious illness communication simulation program, in which our learners would be able to gain mastery in navigating difficult conversations with patients and family members. I continue to run the sim program to this day.

My experiences in Detroit also sparked my curiosity about forming a dedicated embedded palliative care program at our busy academic ED. A few similar programs had already been launched around the country, and as they began publishing the results of their efforts, I started building a proposal for our leadership. The impact from these programs was observed across institutions, noting reduced hospital length of stay, cost utilization, and ICU admission rates. They also observed marked increased patient and ED provider satisfaction.

After several years of discussion, I was ultimately given the green light to launch a three-month pilot where I would be embedded in the ED full-time seeing palliative medicine consults – on hand for urgent goals of care conversations, complex symptom management, and end of life care.

Our pilot launched in January 2024, and it was clear from the first week that we were addressing a critical need. In the month preceding our pilot launch, we had 6 total palliative consults placed from the ED. In the month February 2024 alone, we had tallied 89 consults. By the end of our pilot in April 2024, our division in conjunction with hospital and ED leadership elected to extend the pilot indefinitely. We are continuing to collect data on the program's impact with the hope of publishing our results in the future.

We are now entering the fifth month of our program, and this summer, my team and I were honored to learn that we were being presented with an innovation award from our health system president. It is exciting to be part of something that is both novel and to paraphrase Laura Hopson, serves as "the best part of a patient's worst day."

While I am not currently practicing EM, my training and skills gained in residency have been vital to my success in the ED space, so I am grateful for my experience at U of M. It would be fun to collaborate in the future!


Alumni Update

Department Updates

Transitions: We thank **Dr. Robert Neumar, MD, PhD** for his service as Department Chair, and welcome **Dr. Prashant Mahajan, MD, MPH, MBA** as the incoming Department Chair.

Dr. Robert Neumar, MD, PhD led the Department of Emergency Medicine at the University of Michigan as Department Chair from July 2012 through June 2024, steering it through significant growth and numerous achievements in clinical care, research, and education.

Under Dr. Neumar's leadership, the department saw substantial advancements in clinical services. He oversaw the expansion of the Children's Emergency Services (CES) at C.S. Mott Children's Hospital, which doubled its capacity, catalyzed creation of the Joyce and Don Massey Family Foundation Emergency Critical Care Center (EC3), expanded presence and oversight of the Ann Arbor VA Emergency Department, and expanded local and regional leadership of EMS. This expansion was supported by a doubling of our faculty and the creation of new Divisions of Critical Care, Ultrasound, and Emergency Medical Services (EMS).

Dr. Neumar also spearheaded the diversification and growth of the department's research initiatives. Under his leadership, our department secured over \$118 million in NIH research funding as well as significant CDC, AHRQ, DOD, NSF, foundation and industry funding. Impactful research institutes, centers, and programs were created or grew under his leadership including the Max Harry Weil Institute for Critical Care Research and Innovation, the University of Michigan Injury Prevention Center, and the Michigan Emergency Department Improvement Collaborative (MEDIC) and the Emergency Medicine Education and Research by Global Experts (EMERGE) network. In addition, our faculty assumed leadership of newly formed national research networks including the Strategies to Innovate Emergency Care Clinical Trials Network (SIREN) and StrokeNet. Our faculty were also instrumental in the creation and leadership of the Institute for Firearm Injury Prevention at the University of Michigan. The department has also made important contributions to the EM research investigator workforce through federally and foundation funded research fellowships and career development awards.


Educational initiatives also grew significantly under Dr. Neumar's tenure. He expanded the faculty, reflecting the department's commitment to comprehensive education and mentorship. The residency expanded to 16 trainees per year. New fellowships in Critical Care, Ultrasound, EMS, and Medical Education provided advanced training opportunities and supported the professional development of emerging leaders in emergency medicine. He also supported the Ghana Emergency Medicine Collaborative, extending the department's educational impact globally.

Dr. Neumar's term included significant service and leadership contributions. He fostered a commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion through the appointment of an Associate Chair for DEI, ensuring a supportive and inclusive environment for all faculty, staff, and trainees. Under his leadership, EM faculty members assumed major institutional leadership roles, including Vice President for Research, Executive Vice Dean, Senior Associate Dean, Chief Medical Officer, and Chief of Staff within the University of Michigan and its affiliated hospitals.

The department also benefited from several major philanthropic gifts during Dr. Neumar's tenure. The Joyce and Don Massey Family Foundation have been major supporters of the EC3 and the Massey TBI Research Program. The Weil Family Foundation provided the naming gift to endow the Max Harry Weil Institute for Critical Care Research and Innovation. Dr. Neumar also spearheaded the fundraising for our first endowed professorship, the William G. Barsan Collegiate Professorship, which honors the legacy of our founding department chair.

Dr. Neumar's leadership solidified the University of Michigan's Department of Emergency Medicine's position as a premier academic department. His vision of creating the future of emergency care and investment in our faculty and trainees have set a strong foundation for continued success and innovation. His impactful 12-year tenure will leave a lasting legacy.

Dr. Rebecca Cunningham recently transitioned out of her position at University of Michigan to assume the role of President of the University of Minnesota.

Prior to this, she served as the vice president for research and innovation at the University of Michigan, where she was responsible for fostering excellence and upholding the institution's public mission in research, scholarship and creative practice across three campuses. During her leadership tenure, U-M expanded its research volume to a record \$1.86 billion annually as Cunningham led the design and implementation of the first comprehensive review of the U-M research, scholarship and creative practice enterprise. A faculty member in the U-M Schools of Public Health and Medicine since 1999, Cunningham previously served as the associate vice president for research-health sciences, where she oversaw research faculty affairs and partnered with colleagues across disciplines to facilitate and energize the University's research agenda. Cunningham served in various leadership positions earlier in her career, including as associate chair of emergency medicine and director of the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention-sponsored Injury Prevention Center at the University of Michigan. As a researcher, Cunningham has earned continuous federal research funding for more than 25 years as a principal investigator and is a member of the National Academy of Medicine. She began as the University of Minnesota's 18th president on July 1, 2024.
