Dr. Mani Menon, Professor of Urology from Mount Sinai Health System, will serve as this year's Visiting Professor.

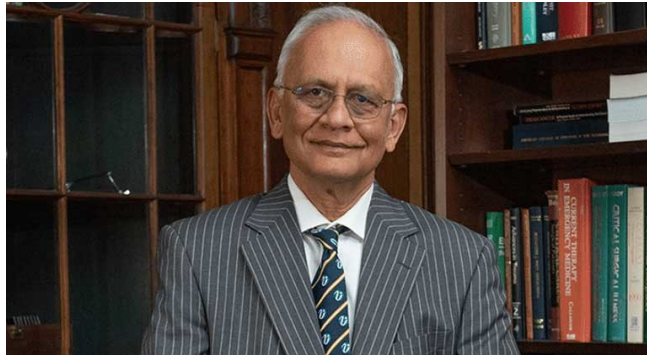
Nesbit Visiting Professor

Mani Menon, MD

Dr. Menon is a pioneering cancer surgeon whose body of work has helped to lay the foundation for modern robotic surgery.

He serves as Chief of Strategy and Innovation in the Department of Urology for the Mount Sinai Health System. He also serves as a Professor of Urology, Director of Education and Director of the Precision Prostatectomy Program in the Department of Urology at Icahn Mount Sinai and Center of Excellence for Prostate Cancer at The Tisch Cancer Institute.

Dr. Menon has personally performed more than 6,000 robotic prostatectomy surgeries and is considered to be one of the foremost surgical innovators in the world.

Dr. Menon is a recipient of several awards such as the Gold Cystoscope award of the American Urological Association; the Dr. B.C. Roy Award from the President of India, which is the highest award given by the Government of India for achievements in medical science; the Hugh Hampton Young Award; the Keyes Medal, and the St. Paul's Medal from the British Association of Urological Surgeons. He has been a visiting professor at more than 50 institutions across the globe, where he has lectured, performed robotic surgery, and trained hundreds of surgeons.

Dr. Menon's team has been involved in the establishment of more than 35 robotic surgery programs in Europe, Asia, and the Americas.

Dr. Menon has published more than 1,000 manuscripts, book chapters, and abstracts, primarily in the field of robotic surgery, kidney transplantation, and urolithiasis.

Dr. Menon graduated from JIPMER in Pondicherry, India, and completed his residency at the Brady Urological Institute at The Johns Hopkins Hospital. He served on the faculty at Washington University in St. Louis from 1980 to 1983, when was appointed Founding Chair and Professor of the Division of Urological and Transplantation Surgery at the University of Massachusetts Medical School. In 1997, Dr. Menon became Chair of the Department of Urology at Henry Ford Hospital and in 2000, was appointed the first Director of the Vattikuti Urology Institute, of which he is now Director Emeritus.



History of the Reed M. Nesbit Urologic Society

The Reed M. Nesbit Urologic Society is the alumni organization of the Department of Urology, University of Michigan. The membership of the Society includes residents who trained at Michigan, clinical fellows, faculty and selected others. The alumni Society is named in honor of Reed M. Nesbit, who was Section Head from 1928 to 1968.

At the time Dr. Nesbit came to Michigan there were no effective antibiotics, fluid and electrolyte balance was poorly understood, and blood transfusions were emerging from the realm of experimental medicine. Considered one of the giants in American urology, he oversaw tremendous advances that were important to the development of endoscopic surgery in urology. Dr. Nesbit trained one resident a year for each of the three years of the urology's early residency program, and he ultimately trained eighty urologists during his tenure, eighteen of whom eventually became heads of urology departments.

The Society was constituted as a non-profit organization in 1972 and the first by-laws were drafted by the late John W. Konnak, MD (Residency 1969). Prior to this time, there had been informal gatherings of alumni dating back to 1963 as part of the overall Michigan Medical Center Alumni Association. At these early meetings the tradition of gathering together to discuss scientific, professional and academic concerns in conjunction with good fellowship and an opportunity to see old friends was firmly established.

At the charter meeting, the by-laws were ratified and the Society's distinct logo was adopted. The logo is a reminder of the long tradition of urology in medicine and its early adoption of science of technology. It has a central image portraying a medieval era urologist performing uroscopy by contemplating the appearance of a jordan (or *matula*) of urine.

Fall meetings were initially held biannually, changing to an annual meeting in 2003. The format usually includes a scientific session with a guest speaker on Friday, a reunion dinner Friday night and a tailgate on Saturday followed by attending a football game at Michigan Stadium. There is also an annual reception held by the Society during the national American Urological Association meeting in April or May.
